

Call for papers 2010

Authors are invited to submit proposals that could be delivered in any of the following presentation formats:

Type of presentation	Duration	Description
Paper presentation	20 min.	Presentation of a paper by one of the paper's authors; the paper will be published in the conference proceedings.
Poster Presentation	60 sec. + 2 hours	Plenary Presentation of 60 seconds is given at poster teaser session and a poster session is reserved in the program; papers are published in the conference proceedings.
Elevator pitch session	5 min. + 20 min. for session questions	5 min. elevator pitch presentations on one specific strand; at least 3 presenters for each symposium; the papers will be published in the conference proceedings.
Round table Session	60 min.	Topic to be proposed by the facilitator; informal discussion; summary report encouraged.
Advanced Workshop	90 + min.	Active learning session on a specific topic area to engage participants; handouts required; slides and handouts welcome for the conference proceedings.
Student projects - CDIO Academy	20 min.	Poster included in poster session and project presented to the jury.

Benchmarking studies and collaborative papers between institutions and programs within and outside the CDIO initiative are particularly encouraged. All papers related to the CDIO initiative are welcomed. The particular topics of interest are the following:

- Sustaining curriculum reform
- Internationalization and Mobility
- Application of CDIO to a wide range of disciplines
- Faculty professional development
- Project based learning
- Training students in informal communication skills
- Industry involvement in engineering education
- Entrepreneurship and Leadership

Other possible topics include:

- Curriculum and program design
- Active and experiential learning

- Design-implement experiences
- Learning environments
- Development of CDIO skills in students
- Assessment of student CDIO skills
- Technology-enhanced learning
- Self evaluation of CDIO programs
- Evaluating the impact of CDIO programs
- Facilitating change in engineering education
- Student involvement in the development of engineering education

Students are invited to submit team and individual projects to the CDIO Academy competition.

All proposals will be reviewed by the Technical Program Committee. The authors of accepted proposals, who submit the papers, will be obliged to guarantee that they register for the Conference, pay the registration fees, attend the Conference, and present their papers. A submitted paper will be published in the conference proceedings only if it is accompanied by the registration form and registration fee for at least one of the authors.

Authors must agree to transfer the copyright for the paper to the CDIO Initiative, should it be accepted for presentation and/or publishing at the 2010 International CDIO Conference. However, authors retain the rights to the fair use of the paper, such as in teaching and other non-profit uses. Authors may also post their papers on their personal websites.
